

PROTECT MY PUBLIC MEDIA

Phil Meyer, SOPBS CEO

Dear Fellow SOPBS Members,

At press time, multiple reports were indicating that the White House is planning to send a rescissions package to Capitol Hill, eliminating previously appropriated funding for public media.

The details have yet to be released, but we anticipate this would include fiscal year (FY) 2026 and FY 2027 advance funding for the Corporation for Public Broadcasting. This is the most serious threat public media has faced in decades.

Upon receipt by Congress, there is a 45-day clock for Congress to act. Members of Congress could amend the package within certain limitations. If Congress does not act within this timeframe, the funding must be released.

Federal funding is essential for local public television stations' ability to provide all Americans in communities across the country with essential services in public safety, education and community connections, everywhere, every day, for free.

At about \$1.60 per person per year, or less than .01% of the federal budget, federal funding for public broadcasting provides an exceptional return on investment through public safety partnerships, educational services and homegrown programming.



There are 170 locally-operated, locally-controlled, locally-focused public television licensees in the country, which reach almost 97 percent of Americans, including more rural and remote communities where commercial television can't succeed.

The Government Accountability Office has concluded that the federal investment is essential to ensuring public television's universal service, particularly in rural America.

For the 22nd year in a row, public television was ranked the most -trusted institution, with 76% of Americans agreeing that public television provides an excellent value to communities.

88% of parents agree that PBS Kids is a trusted and safe source for children to watch television, and play digital games and mobile apps.

Public media has earned the broad support of the American people, across the political

spectrum — including 65% of people who voted for President Trump — who think public television is either adequately funded or underfunded, according to a recent YouGov survey.

SOPBS has never been more **valuable**. And it has never been more **vulnerable**.

As the number of caregivers declines, and the number of individuals requiring care in our country increases, the challenges grow. Caregivers require differing types and levels of support.

At times, the burdens of caregiving can seem unbearable, regardless of resources. The "needs gap" for information may be greater for caregivers than it is for care recipients.


- *According to recent reports, it is estimated that between 53 million to 105.6 million U.S. adults provide unpaid caregiving for family and friends.
- *An estimated 5.4 million children and adolescents in the U.S. are direct caregivers for family members.

*The value of the care provided by unpaid family caregivers across the U.S. was \$600 billion in 2021, according to a 2023 AARP report.

There are five million paid caregivers nationally in the U.S., as of 2023.

Median annual earnings for direct care workers in the U.S. are \$23,688.13, as of a 2023 report.

A majority of Americans cannot afford to take care of their families. They see it as their responsibility, and often their failure. To get by, they cobble together solutions, even quitting their jobs to look after a loved one – a newborn, a parent, a friend, or an in-law. Things are getting worse as baby boomers age into their 70s. We are facing a social crisis as America's piecemeal and expensive care infrastructure, created a half century ago, has reached a breaking point.





Alphy and Geordie keep an eye on rising tensions as a controversial figure is invited to speak at the university. When a murder is committed, however, they disagree on how to approach the case.



During the 1960s, as a teenager, acclaimed American singer-songwriter Janis Ian used to jam with Jimi Hendrix in Greenwich Village bars and partied with Janis Joplin, who jokingly called herself "the other Janis." During the 70s, Janis befriended Bruce Springsteen as they simultaneously recorded albums at the same studio. In the 80s, she played duets with Dolly Parton and Willie Nelson in Nashville.


She lived the adventurous life of a rock star. At the same time, she contributed hit songs to the American pop canon that addressed severe social problems, winning the Grammy Award for Best Female Pop Vocal Performance. She encountered her share of setbacks and stress: there have been times when she's been dropped by her record label, struggled to land gigs, and lived on a fast-food diet.

Janis Ian and the Art of Song (working title) will chronicle the singer's epic life journey beginning with her Jewish childhood on a chicken farm in New Jersey; her youthful struggle with notoriety following her hit "Society's Child" (about an interracial love); her ascent to fame with the single "At Seventeen" (about body shaming); and her release of the disruptive album BREAKING SILENCE which she leveraged to come out publicly about her loving relationship with her wife Pat Snyder.

With access to Janis lan's incredible body of music, her vast archive, family, friends, famed collaborators, and music journalists, the film has an intimacy of a home movie set against a sweeping historical context — all visioned through a contemporary lens.


